


Salvador's Journey







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
SALVADOR'S JOURNEY:

My dad is 95 with chronic COPD. His care has always been complicated. But he's strong and I'm determined.




Patricia:

When he got COVID, I knew I needed to find the best care available, but he needed the comfort and stability of being at home.




Patricia:

CareMore NP:


We understood the challenges they faced.

Patricia:


Together we made sure his respiration was always monitored. That was a relief.

On that special day almost anything seemed possible Triumphant on a bike, you could see Don smile from 300 yards away.


> Just days before entering hospice, Don met the Aspire team at a race track in sunny California. There he was given the opportunity to ride once more.


Don often spoke about his love for motorcross. Upon hearing this, the team quickly organized a special day at the track just for him.

Hospice care at a skilled nursing facility was quickly arranged. But in order to treat the whole person, we needed medicine for the soul.


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DON'S JOURNEY:



Voice of Ari Aspire Remote Social Worker:

Don is the kind of guy that didn't need to ask people for help.

VO: When we first came in contact with him he was living in an RV. He had no access to care or medications, suffering from cancer and chronic homelessness he was barely surviving.



Voice of Ari:

Don was brought on to Aspire because of an insurance algorithym. Given certain risk factors patients are recommeded for this overarching wrap-around palliative care service.


VO: Don needed a stable living situation and access to health care and medications.

I think the bike was such a good medicine to him, it gave him a perspective of I can keep going. I don't need to give up. It gave him peace.




